BADM 1113	Introduction to Business	<ul> <li>Comprehensive, professional resume highlighting relevant business experience in management, organization, human resources, marketing, finance, and business ethics</li> <li>Proof of certification and/or training related to business systems (if applicable)</li> <li>Two letters of recommendation from former employers endorsing prior professional conduct</li> </ul>		
ENGL 1033	Technical Writing I	<ul> <li>Comprehensive, professional resume highlighting relevant business experience</li> <li>Two letters of recommendation from former employers endorsing the student's communication skills</li> <li>Writing samples to include a business letter addressing a customer's dissatisfaction, emails to supervisor, colleague, and subordinate related to changes in policy, memorandum sharing good news (samples can be either from prior employers you authored or generated from scratch as samples of the student's communication style)</li> </ul>		
ENGL 1113	Freshman Composition I	<ul> <li>Successful completion of the College Composition Modular (minimum score 50)</li> <li>Submission of a writing sample packet that includes 4 essays, 2-4 pages in length: narrative, descriptive effect, definition, illustrative, and process (submissions should include an outline, rough draft, and revised/final version)</li> <li>Cover letter highlighting why the student believes (s)he mastered this course and how the samples reflect the student's communication style and past experiences</li> <li>Two letters of recommendation from former employers endorsing the student's communication skills</li> </ul>		
ENGL 1213	Freshman Composition II	<ul> <li>Have taken or received credit for ENGL 1113 (a prerequisite course)</li> <li>Submission of a writing sample packet that includes 2, original, non-research essays, 2-4 pages in length: compare-contrast, cause-effect, and/or classification-division (submissions should include an outline, rough draft, and revised/final version)</li> <li>Submission of an 8-12-page, MLA formatted, original research argument essay demonstrating knowledge of an argument, the writing process, the third point of view, research, and MLA formatting (submissions should include an outline, rough draft, revised/final version, and incorporate 10 references using proper paraphrasing and quotations)</li> <li>Cover letter highlighting why the student believes (s)he mastered this course and how the samples reflect the student's communication style and past experiences</li> <li>Two letters of recommendation from former employers endorsing the student's communication skills</li> </ul>		



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ENGL 2033	Technical Writing II	<ul> <li>Have taken or received credit for ENGL 2033 (a prerequisite course), or comparable equivalency</li> <li>Comprehensive, professional resume highlighting relevant business experience</li> <li>Two letters of recommendation from former employers endorsing the student's communication skills</li> <li>Writing samples to include 4, original, 8-10-page documents that illustrate the student's ability to generate technical reports, collect data and research, provide technical descriptions, and generate interpretative analysis. Writing samples will be assessed based on student's ability to create formal reports that are well organized, stylistically relevant, formatted consistently, and includes graphics elements or illustrations.</li> </ul>			
ENGL 2113	Creative Writing	<ul> <li>Cover letter highlighting why the student believes (s)he mastered this course from prior professional experience</li> <li>Comprehensive, professional resume highlighting relevant communication experience</li> <li>Two letters of recommendation from former employers endorsing the student's communication skills</li> <li>Submission of a writing sample packet that includes 4, original, non-research pieces, 2-6 pages in length: fiction, non-fiction, poetry, play or movie script, or biographical (including autobiographic)</li> <li>Submission of a 6-10-page, research persuasive essay demonstrating knowledge of an argument, the writing process, the third point of view, and applied research (submissions should include evidence of first draft and revision of the work such as an outline, rough draft, and final version)</li> </ul>			
HHP 1113	Personal Health	<ul> <li>Cover letter highlighting why the student believes (s)he mastered this course from prior professional experience</li> <li>Comprehensive, professional resume highlighting relevant experience including (but not limited to) health education, training in workplace safety, workshops related to substance abuse, mental health, first aid/CPR, Title IX, blood borne pathogens, or other health related events</li> <li>Proof of certification and/or training related to relevant experience (if applicable)</li> <li>A letter of recommendation from former employers endorsing the student's knowledge and practice of health and wellness in the workplace</li> </ul>			



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HUM 1013	Humanities I	<ul> <li>Cover letter highlighting why the student believes (s)he mastered this course from prior professional experience</li> <li>Submission of a writing 4-6 pages writing sample with references related to themes involving the classical period through the European Renaissance</li> <li>Comprehensive, professional resume highlighting relevant experience in the humanities including but not limited to work in museum or other cultural institution</li> <li>One letter of recommendation from former employers endorsing the student's prior work</li> </ul>		
HUM 1033	Humanities II	<ul> <li>Cover letter highlighting why the student believes (s)he mastered this course from prior professional experience</li> <li>Submission of a writing 4-6 pages writing sample with references related to themes involving the Baroque period through (Post) Modernism</li> <li>Comprehensive, professional resume highlighting relevant experience in the humanities including but not limited to work in museum or other cultural institution</li> <li>One letter of recommendation from former employers endorsing the student's prior work</li> </ul>		
MGMT 2313	Principles of Management	<ul> <li>Cover letter highlighting why the student believes (s)he mastered this course from prior professional experience</li> <li>Comprehensive, professional resume highlighting relevant experience in business including supervising staff in areas of planning, organizational leadership, human resources, program oversight, and fiscal accountability</li> <li>Proof of certification and/or training related to relevant experience (if applicable)</li> <li>Two letters of recommendation from former employers endorsing the student's prior work</li> </ul>		
MGMT 2603	Human Resource Management	<ul> <li>Cover letter highlighting why the student believes (s)he mastered this course from prior professional experience</li> <li>Comprehensive, professional resume highlighting relevant experience and extensive work in human resource management and development</li> <li>Proof of certification and/or training related to relevant experience (if applicable)</li> <li>Two letters of recommendation from former employers endorsing the student's prior work</li> </ul>		



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MGMT 2913	Leadership and Organizational Behavior	<ul> <li>Cover letter highlighting why the student believes (s)he mastered this course from prior professional experience</li> <li>Comprehensive, professional resume highlighting extensive experience as an organizational leader with a background in resource management, diversity, helping staff with professional growth, motivation, organizational development and change, implementation, group dynamics and performance improvement planning</li> <li>Proof of certification and/or training related to relevant experience (if applicable)</li> <li>Two letters of recommendation from former employers endorsing the student's prior work</li> </ul>		
PHIL 1013	Ethics of Leadership	<ul> <li>Essay of 4-6 page with references discussing three core principles to ethical leadership</li> <li>Comprehensive, professional resume highlighting relevant experience that speaks to the student's experience as an ethical employee</li> <li>Two letters of recommendation from former employers endorsing the student's ethical behavior in a professional setting</li> </ul>		
PHIL 1213	Ethics	<ul> <li>Essay of 4-6 page with references discussing three core principles to ethical behavior in the workplace</li> <li>Comprehensive, professional resume highlighting relevant experience that speaks to the student's experience as an ethical employee</li> <li>Two letters of recommendation from former employers endorsing the student's ethical behavior in a professional setting</li> </ul>		
SPCH 1113	Introduction to Speech	<ul> <li>An 8-10-minute excerpt of a speech or formal public presentation</li> <li>Proof of certification and/or training related to speech or public presentation such as Toastmasters International (if applicable)</li> <li>A letter of recommendation from a professional contact attesting to the student's skills as a presenter, trainer, or public presenter</li> </ul>
